First Base Food Bank

Mark Frankland of First Base has told us that pre-Covid they were distributing 600 food parcels a week throughout Dumfries & Galloway. At its peak during lockdown this had risen to 2,400!!! It has now levelled off to around 1,400. BUT he dreads the result of the £20 a week reduction in universal credit received during the pandemic and knows that the numbers will soar again.
