Eco Snippet

There is currently no plastic-free crisp packaging widely available from any brand. Although the inside of a crisp packet is shiny and looks like foil, it is in fact a metallized plastic film. Most crisp packets consist of multiple layers and because they are currently non-recyclable they end up in landfill even cardboard tubes aren't much better as they are of mixed material and therefore difficult to recycle. So try these ...

HOMEMADE CRISPS

1 tsp veg oil; 1 potato sliced paper-thin; ¹/₂ tsp salt
Coat potato slices evenly with veg oil
Oil large dinner plate
Arrange as many of the potato slices as possible in single layer on plate
Cook in microwave for 3-5 mins or until lightly browned (times depend on power)
Remove from plate, toss with salt/other seasonings
Repeat with remaining potato slices
