A Message from our Minister:

I don't know if any of you watch the One Show (7pm BBC1, weekdays) but on Monday (28th March) they featured a 101-year-old pilot flying the same type of airplane he flew as a young man after WW2. He was one of the pioneers for the Mission Aviation Fellowship, working in remote areas with small airplanes to help communities who had little more than a spare flat field to serve as a runway. They act as ambulances, carry supplies, enable health workers to reach distant communities, and in doing so, share God's Love in a practical way. This Sunday we'll hear about their work as we welcome Brian McBride to our churches – join us to find out more. As we pray for the work of MAF, we also continue to pray for the situation in Ukraine, the agencies working with the displaced, and the many refugees (often stuck under paperwork). COVID rules for Places of Worship become guidelines on Monday (4th) – masks and socialdistancing will no longer be compulsory in law! I am sure many of you will still be nervous about mixing in crowds without those protections, so we will be working to ensure that in our buildings there will be some seating spread out for social-distancing in case that is needed. As most of you know, we still need to be careful (hand-washing, coughing into elbows, etc.) to keep each other safe. It also means super-loud 'Hosannas' next Sunday, unmuffled by face-coverings.
