## A Message from our Minister

Today we come together as congregations to celebrate Holy Communion, the Lord's Supper!

Jesus invites us all to meet with Him round His table, using the symbols He gave us (bread and wine) to remind us of Him and all that He has done for us. The invitation is for everyone.

Our Bible reading is from the end of James' letter. He rounds off his encouragements and challenges by reminding those early Christians of the need to pray.

Our background thoughts during September have been about our responsibility to be good stewards of Creation – a task which seems daunting, maybe impossible. People like me often say "pray about it" but that doesn't seem to be enough – we want things to happen! Now!

James knew that prayer alone was not the answer, but it is the starting point. As we pray, we become attuned to God's Way. That's dangerous because God may well ask us to be part of the answer to our own prayers! To act! We need to be brave – acknowledging our need for help.

In Communion we remember how God acted to enable us to be His friends again. Not what was expected, not what had been done before. He gave us Himself, He gave up Himself, He became a servant and sacrifice. That is God's Way – are we brave enough to follow it?
