A Message from our Minister:

Welcome to AD2025! May God Bless you with Peace and Joy! Don't forget what the AD stands for: Anno Domini – the Year of the Lord. Not PC today, but essential for us on our journey of faith. We stand in the Lord's time, seeking His Way for our lives, needing His Blessing and support through our lives, whatever we face.

The visit of the Magi to Bethlehem is known as Epiphany, or The Manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles (there will be a test!). We think of an epiphany as a sudden, dramatic, revelation leading to a change of life direction — think of Paul on the road to Damascus. You may have had some yourself over the years. We often hope that a new year will bring such a change for us, hence our resolutions!

The Magi studied the skies for signs of change, believing that all things were interlinked. Many of us studied the skies for the Aurora – I hope you weren't disappointed. However, the Magi didn't just note down the new star they saw, they followed it, acting to confirm what they believed. That's good scientific method – testing a hypothesis. We don't know how they reacted when they got home, but we know that they were the first Gentiles (non-Jews) to see the Messiah, the new King, promised in Scriptures by the prophets for the faithful and signalled in the sky for the rest of the world to see! Understanding the science behind the Aurora shouldn't diminish the wonder of seeing it. It shouldn't stop us wanting to see it again – each manifestation is unique.

Following Jesus is like that. Understanding more of what Jesus has done for us and how much He loves us shouldn't diminish the wonder of knowing Him. It shouldn't stop us wanting to know Him more, follow Him more closely, become more like Him, receive His blessings more – a unique experience for each of us.

Let's make 2025 a true AD – The Year of our Lord. God Bless, Mark
