Remember Toilet Twinning? Our Eco-group are encouraging us to think about the Garden Twinning scheme as a way of helping those in need across the world. June Harmer has information on this.

Ecosnippet: If you like a coffee when out and about, which chain is the most ethical choice? Ethical Consumer has carried out their analysis and, of those that you might encounter in this part of the world, Greggs does OK at 48 out of 100 [in part due to using Fairtrade coffee], Café Nero is middling at 23 out of 100 while Starbucks and Costa are poor [12 and 7 out of 100 respectively] and McDonalds scores a dismal 5. Alternatively, look for an independent that serves Fairtrade coffee. The Usual Place in Dumfries is a good example of this.
